ATTENDANCE

- Students with 100% attendance will be awarded with cash prize on College Day.
- Students who are not able to attend the college due to their medical condition, should produce a valid medical certificate immediately after they rejoin the class.
- If a Student is absent for 10 continuous days his/her name will be removed from the attendance register.
- Taking leave without prior information and coming late to the classes will be reported to the HOD & Principal.

IDENTITY CARD AND ATTENDANCE RULES

- Students must wear their College Identity Card inside the campus; otherwise, they will not be allowed to attend classes.
- Students are expected to be punctual and must be present in class by 9.00 a.m.
- Students are not allowed to enter after 9.15 a.m.
- Loitering in the campus during class hours is strictly prohibited.
- Mass absenteeism and instigating fellow students to take leave or go on strike may result in expulsion from the college.

CAMPUS ENTRY AND EXIT REGULATIONS

- No student shall leave the college campus during college hours without a gate pass signed by the HOD and Principal.
- The college gates will remain closed during break hours, and students cannot leave the campus during intervals.

ACADEMIC RESPONSIBILITIES

- Students should observe laboratory safety measures and maintain cleanliness in laboratories.
- Students are expected to perform well in Internal Assessment Tests.
- Students must complete assignments given in each subject during the semester.

DISCIPLINE AND CONDUCT

- The college maintains strict discipline, and students violating college rules are liable to severe punishment, including dismissal.
- Students dismissed due to disciplinary actions will not be entitled to receive certificates or refunds of fees and deposits.

CONSEQUENCES OF VIOLATIONS

- Violation of college rules may result in:

Any violation of the college rules and regulations will be viewed seriously and may result in disciplinary action depending on the nature and severity of the offence. Such actions may include a warning, imposition of a fine, recovery of the cost of any damages caused to college property, suspension from classes or college activities, and, in serious cases, expulsion from the college. Where applicable, the college may also withhold certificates and deny the refund of fees and deposits in accordance with institutional policies.

CHANGE OF RESIDENCE

The students should report to the college office whenever he/she shifts their residence. Failure to report within three days will be considered as a serious breach of discipline.

USAGE OF MOBILE PHONES

- Use of mobile phones, i-pods etc. are not permitted in the campus.
- Severe action will be taken against those students who are found using mobile phones inside the campus, which includes confiscation of the device.

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE / DISCIPLINARY ACTION COMMITTEE

- The college has constituted an Anti Ragging Committee (ARC) comprising of Principal / Vice-Principal / Student Representatives / Senior Faculty / Student Advisor.
- The college has also a Disciplinary Action Committee (DAC) comprising of Vice-Principal, Deans and HODs of all departments, who assist to maintain discipline.
- ARC / DAC functions to oversee and maintain discipline on campus, in the buses and in the hostel premises.

Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1997

Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act 1997 prohibits ragging in any form within or outside the educational institution. Ragging and any form of abetment to ragging, causing injury or subjecting to forceful confinement, physical and sexual assault and eve-teasing would be treated as a criminal offence.

What is Ragging?

Ragging means display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear, shame or embarrassment to a student in any institution. It also includes teasing, abusing, playing practical jokes, or hurting student.

Penalty for Ragging

Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates “ragging” inside or outside any educational institution shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend upto two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to Rs.20,000/-

Dismissal of Student

Any student, who is convicted under any IPC Section, will be dismissed from the educational institution and those students will not be admitted in any other educational institution.

Suspension of Student

- Without prejudice to the forgoing provisions, whenever any student complains of ragging to the Head or the Management, the issue will be inquired immediately. If found true, they shall suspend the guilty without prejudice.
- The decision of the Management will be final, if any student indulged in ragging under IPC Section.
- The concerned student will be given liberty to give explanation about the incident and if it is found unsatisfactory, the Management will dismiss him/her from the institution.

LIBRARY

The library of Hindustan College of Arts & Science is a valued partner in learning, teaching and research for the college. It is also an Institutional Member of the British Council Library, American Consulate Library, Chennai and Inflibnet.

The college library consists of more than 21,168 core books, a large number of journals and magazines, periodicals and 10 newspapers. The library provides access to online resources and wide range of databases to enhance the research knowledge of faculties and students.

Library working hours

The library is open on all working days from 9.00 a.m. to 5:00p.m. (Monday to Friday) and 9.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. (Saturdays).

Conditions to issue Books

ID cards with Barcode should be used to borrow books from the Library.

Renewal of Books

Books will be issued for a maximum period of two weeks. Books must be renewed to extend the period.

Loss of Books

The readers will be responsible for any damage in the borrowed books. If the Reader lose the book and he / she is not able to replace it, he/she has to pay twice the price of the book. Replacement of books should be done within seven days from the date of intimation, failing to do so, a nominal fine will be levied. The same procedure will be followed for the loss of library tickets.

No Dues

To get “No Dues” certificate at the end of the course, the student should return all the library books.

CAMPUS FACILITIES

- The college provides an extensive bus transportation facility covering various parts of the city for the convenience of students and staff.
- A branch of Indian Overseas Bank (IOB) is located within the college campus to facilitate banking services for students, staff, and visitors.
